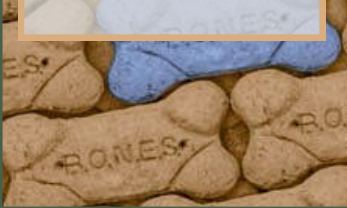

Why Senior Dogs Make Such Good Pets

- ♥ What you see is what you get! You already know how big she/he'll be and what her/his personality will be like
- ♥ Seniors have had time to develop an "off" switch – they're content to rest and relax with you, and don't have those all day long bursts of energy that puppies can have
- ♥ Your belongings are likely safe. Older dogs are past the puppy stage of chewing everything they can get their mouth on. While they may still enjoy a good chew toy, they're a lot less likely to leave teeth marks on your new iPhone or kitchen cabinets
- ♥ Seniors are most often used to the rhythms of a household. They don't usually need to get up three times in the middle of the night for a potty break, and know that breakfast will be served without making you crazy
- ♥ Housetraining! Most senior rescues are already house trained. No worries about potty training a puppy with a tiny bladder!
- ♥ Seniors are never too old to learn new tricks! Most of the time they already know what we want them to know about being good housemates.
- ♥ You don't need to take them on multiple long hikes/day. They're happy with a nice stroll around the neighborhood or a trip to the local pet supply shop. If you're up for a long walk or hike, chances are good your senior dog will be very happy to join you!

We are very proud of our work with seniors. To address the problem of placing senior dogs B.O.N.E.S. developed the **Sensational Senior Beagle Program** to encourage people/families to provide a home with a "supported adoption" for the dog's remaining years. It is our hope that this program will allow us to help more of the hundreds of requests we get to take in beagles over the age of 10. We are very happy to be able to offer this program that gives seniors a loving place to rest their heads during their golden years.

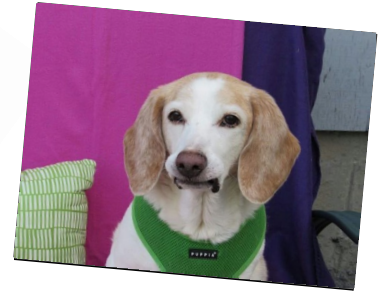

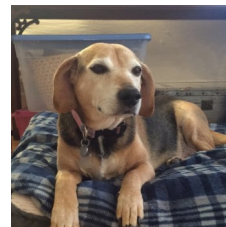
Sensational Senior Beagle Updates
